A successful year for Pamber Heath Scout Group, we continued to grow in members in most sections.

Beavers section continues to be at capacity and Cubs have grown from 8 to 17 members allowing the section to have 3 Sixes. Scouts have capacity for more, even though they tried a recruitment drive, see Scout section for further details.

ANNUAL STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

Treasurers' Report

Bank balances are both healthy at the end of the year, and although an overall loss is reported, Subs and donations have covered the day to day running costs of the Group. The main expense this year was the restoration of the toilets costing £7350 but this was funded using the Covid Grants received in previous years. All activities have paid for themselves and no fund raising was required.

Gift Aid from 20/21 and 21/22 has now been received and 22/23 will be submitted soon. This will boost the bank balance by approx ± 1000 providing parents/carers Gift Aid declarations are up to date.

A new Gas contract is now in place for the Scout Hut. For the past few years PHSG group were paying residential rates but this has now been amended to a business tariff. I tried negotiating the very best rates for the charity and am hoping despite the change to the new business rates and the rise in energy costs, there will not be a large increase. The change-over is still ongoing so the bills have not levelled themselves out yet.

Repair work to the car park cost just over £400 but we were lucky enough to receive a community grant to cover this in February. Expenses for this project were paid after year-end and do not show in this financial year but have been taken into account for the purpose of this report.
