#### Building an exciting future for the Group

It is an exciting time for the Group with lots of plans for the future that will really help to enhance the experience of our young people and ensure they gaining skills for life and have all the fun and adventure that we can offer.

The past 12-months have seen some exciting highs – like to the opening of Squirrel Scouts – our early years section for boys and girls who are 4-5 years old.

Unfortunately, due to a lack of adult volunteers we have temporarily closed our Beaver Scout Colony, but aim to get that back up and running during the autumn term.

Scouting operates with volunteers at all levels from running the weekly meetings to the trustees who ensure we manage the Scout Group effectively. Without the time and energy they put in Scouting just does not happen.

The best kept secret of Scouting of course is that we all have a lot of fun along the way and learn new skills just like the young people.

Numbers across the Group are very strong and are continuing to rise. Even so, we do have space for additional young people now and are keen to boost our numbers further.

The infrastructure of the group is important and In the summer term the hall was repainted thanks to support from AWE who came in the work. This was greatly appreciated and makes a real difference.



We are in the process of replacing the lighting within the hall to LED lighting to improve the green credentials of the hall, as part of a longer-term sustainability project.

We are developing a five-year plan for the Group to improve storage facilities for equipment and then to replace a lot of the camping equipment. This will need support with fund raising.

Part of that plan is about increasing the number of young people across all of the sections. This will require additional adult volunteers to enable this to happen.

Together, with your help we have a lot to look forward to in supporting the young people of our community to have a fantastic Scouting experience.

### **Squirrel Scouts**

The opening of our Squirrel Drey in October 2024 marked an exciting new chapter for Pamber Heath Scout Group.

With just a few children we started small, however, since then our numbers have grown to 10, with two new starters in September. Two Squirrels are due to Move forward into Beavers this term. We now have 4 leaders with a rota for helpers.

We have played games, learning to join in and work as teams, helping each other. We have done exciting experiments and learning about nature, science, space and many other activities. The Squirrels are having fun but don't realise they are learning at the same time.

We visited a Fire Station, and learnt about the equipment and how the Firefighters are heroes. They all had a go at using a hose. They found that enormous fun!!

This term we are planning a visit to Tadley Air Cadets and a visit from a Guide dog and owner, learning how dogs can be heroes too.

During this year the children have been working hard and have achieved so much. So far we have awarded 82 badges, with 15 more to come, including three Chief Scouts Acorn Awards. (two more nearly there). The feed back from the parents has all been very positive. Stating that their children can't wait for the next session. We are very proud of the achievements of the children with both badges that they have attained and how they have grown in confidence, learning to make friends and participation. Shyness and apprehension soon disappears.





#### **Cub Scouts**

Last year was a very busy year for the Cubs! Whether it was art, games, learning or exploring, the Cubs threw themselves into every evening; it's been an absolute joy to see them take on new challenges, work as a team and take on new responsibilities.

As always, when we could go outside we did. We built fires and toasted marshmallows, undertook a night hike with torches, went for a wildlife-spotting walk, and built dens in Pamber Forest. Many of the Cubs went sailing at Burghfield. The end of summer term was celebrated with a water fight, followed by hot chocolate to warm back up.

We were thankful to members of the community who supported us this year. The Tadley Firefighters welcomed us into the Fire Station and even gave every Cub a chance to use the fire hose; their fence has never been so clean!

Tadley Men's Shed gave up two evenings to be with us, teaching the Cubs how to use power tools (which was far scarier for the leaders than for the Cubs) and then helping us to make bat boxes for the den.
A local photographer visited us bringing their amazing array of cameras; the leaders showed our age a little when we realised that the Cubs had never seen a camera film before.

#### **Scouts**

We have increased the number of scouts numbers from 8 to 13. We have offered more nights away in 2025 as we did in 2023 and 2024 combined. So far in 2025 we have issued 96 badges and will issue a further 34 badges before the end of the season.

The winter programme consisted of tie-dying tee shirts, painting and playing Warhammer, followed by attendance of a joint camp with 24<sup>th</sup> Basingstoke.

We started the spring season with an evening of engineering challenges and Lego.

A few nights targeted the various challenge badges, including the personal challenge and world badges.
